# Our Sacred Stories The Cross: God's Great Sign of Love (Fr. John Jennings)

God so loved the world that he gave his only begotten Son, so that everyone who believes him may not perish but may have eternal life.

This little piece from John's Gospel (Jn. 3:13-17), is part of a conversation that John describes between Jesus and a leading Pharisee named Nicodemus. In the conversation the Gospel writer presents something of the faith held by our earliest ancestors in our faith. Jesus is at the center of this faith, as he is central to our own. His presence in our faith and our lives is an expression of God's love for all. We celebrate this loving gift in two great moments of our faith - the Incarnation and the Paschal Mystery. The conversation of Jesus and Nicodemus presents this faith.

The Cross is very much the symbol and sign of our shared faith. We see presented in our churches, in our homes, as pins and neck ornaments. The cross is portrayed on clothing and uniforms. It is even found in gestures, as when we bless ourselves or one another. In however we use this Cross, it makes a statement of our shared faith in Jesus the Christ.

Like all signs and symbols, the Cross has many aspects and over time, these various aspects are emphasized differently. The Cross is fundamentally an expression of how God, through Jesus the Christ, took on our humanity to express love and sustain us with this gift of life, eternally.

Through the centuries, Christians have expressed their faith in the art of their time. As they did so, it revealed what was primary to their faith at that time. The earliest images of Jesus in the first several centuries were the images of Jesus as the Good Shepherd. Central to this early faith was the warmth, care and compassion of the shepherd for the sheep and the lambs of his flock.

As time moved on other images began to be used in expressing the Christian faith. As Christianity spread and grew, the Cross certainly entered the picture as a sign or symbol of the faith. It is significant that the form of the Cross that was initially used and which continued to be dominant for almost a thousand years was a sign of the victory of the Cross over death. It represented the Paschal Mystery – Jesus the Christ and His life, death and resurrection.

Slowly from the 11<sup>th</sup> century onward, another form of the Cross came to be more common. This form of the crucifix continues today. Its focus is more on the suffering of the passion of Jesus.

More often this is the Cross we find in the Roman Catholic Church today.

Since Vatican II, in the 1960's there has been some revival of the earlier Cross which better represents the full story of the passion, death and resurrection of Jesus the Christ.

This Cross emphasizes the Easter event of Jesus's resurrection and helps us to recognize the meaning of the passion of Jesus leading to the promise of new and risen life that flows from God's love.

The letter of St. Paul to the Philippians includes what is probably a hymn used by early Christians in their liturgies. The words of this hymn express the Cross as victory over death:

Christ Jesus, though he was in the form of God, did not regard equality with God as something to be exploited, but emptied himself taking the form of a slave, being born in human likeness, and being found in human form, he humbled himself and became obedient to the point of death – even death on a cross. Therefore, God highly exalted him, and every tongue should confess that Jesus Christ is Lord, to the glory of God the Father (Phil.2:6-11).
